Even amid the coronavirus pandemic, we must not allow leprosy to be forgotten.





Based on his philosophy that solutions are found in the field, as WHO Goodwill Ambassador he has visited around 100 countries to see the situation for himself and met with more than 150 national leaders to convey why leprosy still requires their attention if we are to achieve a leprosy-free world.

To date has supported 37 organizations of persons affected by leprosy in 22 countries, helping to empower them and promote their social and economic rehabilitation.






Join us on the last mile to end leprosy
