Japanese Government Goodwill Ambassador for the Human Rights of Persons Affected by Leprosy

Leprosy is not a disease of the past. Around 200,000 new cases are still reported worldwide every year. Also known as Hansen's disease, leprosy is curable and early detection and treatment can prevent disability. However, many cases remain hidden, contributing to ongoing transmission.

There is another reason why leprosy persists: stigma and discrimination. Since ancient times, the disease has been the subject of intense discrimination. There are still over 100 discriminatory laws across more than 20 countries.

I often talk about the fight against leprosy in terms of a motorcycle: the front wheel symbolizes curing the disease; the back wheel represents eliminating stigma and discrimination. If the two wheels do not turn together, we will not make progress. In order to solve this medical and human rights issue, we must continue to send the message that leprosy must not be neglected at any time. One such initiative is the "Don't Forget Leprosy" campaign, which I launched during the COVID pandemic.

We have reached the last mile of the fight against leprosy. But the last mile of a 100-mile journey is only halfway— and the last mile will be tougher than the previous 99. So, let us work together towards a leprosy-free world.

Role and achievements as WHO Goodwill Ambassador

Yohei Sasakawa has spent some 50 years seeking to eliminate leprosy: he regards this as his life mission. In his role as WHO Goodwill Ambassador, he engages with political leaders, human rights experts, health professionals and media, and regularly visits communities of people affected by leprosy.

Sasakawa believes that persons affected by leprosy should play a leading role in the fight against leprosy and has supported their activities and the development of their organizations.

Raising awareness

Sasakawa raises awareness of leprosy through the media and by organizing conferences, symposiums, workshops and the annual Global Appeal to End Stigma and Discrimination against Persons Affected by Leprosy, which is supported by high-profile individuals and organizations.

Since his appointment, Sasakawa has visited some 100 countries to hear directly from persons affected by leprosy about issues they face.

Advocating for human rights

Sasakawa regards discrimination against persons affected by leprosy as a violation of human rights. His advocacy was instrumental in the adoption of the 2010 UN General Assembly resolution on elimination of discrimination against persons affected by leprosy and their families and its accompanying principles and guidelines.

Connecting stakeholders

Sasakawa observes activities at the grassroots level and conveys the voices of people affected by leprosy to political and administrative leaders.
