Old tale: The huge stone in the Yura River
Long time ago, a girl often watched over her little brother in law by the riverside. One day, they both slipped into the river by mistake and were found in dead downstream of the Koono bridge. After that, this place was called "Moribuchi." In Moribuchi is a big stone called "Hotokei-wa" that is in the river for comforting the spirit of the girl and her bother. It's said the lullaby she sang still remains in this area.

The Three Temples of Ohno Village

Ohno has 3 temples each for different sects of Buddhism: Nichiren, True Pure Land, and Soto Zen. Based on the river's flow, the Rinsyo Temple is called "Kamideta" (upper temple), Zensai Temple is called "Nakadera" (center temple), and Rinsyo temple is called "Shimodera" (bottom temple). During New Year's celebrations, a lot of locals visit these temples. A temple visit will let you feel the rich history of this area.

Ninsei's House

Nonomura Ninsei, a ceramic artist in Edo period, was born in this house. Traditional architecture styles such as thatched roof still remain here. Ninsei created colorful ceramics in the Kyoto style. Many of his ceramic works still remain today and are designated as National Treasures.

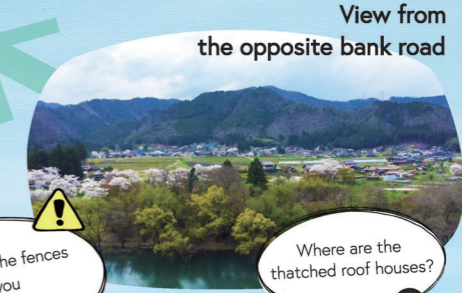


Mojigaichi Bridge

Nijinoko Tunnel

After crossing the Koono Bridge, going up the slope, soon you can see the 81-meter-long Nijinoko Tunnel. It is quiet enough to hear the echo of clapping hands in the silence.

Passing through the Nijinoko tunnel, you can overlook Ohno Village. From here, it's looks like a diorama. The thatched roof houses can be found if you look hard enough.
