While the project is mainly targeted at researchers who are interested in Japan, it is also aimed at opinion leaders and intellectuals specializing in areas other than Japan studies.

We have been donating English books to libraries and research institutions around the world since 2006. The books are categorized by genre, and applicants can select the books that best suit their institutions.

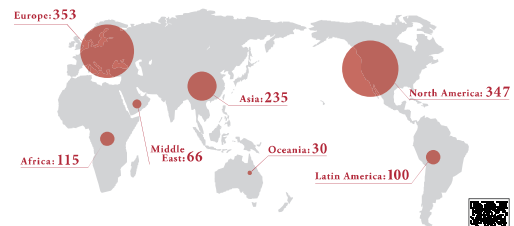

APPLICATION PROCESS

- ### 1 Ask Japanese Embassies and Consulates for a Reference

To apply, you will first need to obtain a letter of reference from the Japanese embassy or consulate in your country or region. If you are interested in receiving books from the project, please contact them and ask for a letter of reference.
- ### 2 Submit Your Application to the Secretariat

Prepare your applications online by going to the project website to choose the books you wish to receive. Be sure to have the detailed contact information you will be asked to provide on hand. You will also need to submit a GDPR consent form. The secretariat will cover book and shipping costs. Applicants are asked to bear major duties, VAT, and other charges incurred locally.
- ### 3 Screening by the Secretariat

The completed applications will be screened by the secretariat. Due to budget limitations, the secretariat may limit the number of books shipped. It also reserves the right to give priority to certain countries or institutions (such as a newly established department of Japanese studies in need of resources). Applicants can provide additional information in the application form.
- ### 4 Approval Notice and Shipment

Institutions whose applications have been approved will be notified by the secretariat and provided with shipping details. An official letter from the secretariat chairman will also be sent. The entire process from application, screening, and approval takes around three days. In the meantime, applicants can check for updates on the READ JAPAN PROJECT website.
